Requirements

| 1. Monster mayhem FF231-3 | 1/2 yard – 50cm |
| 2. Monster circles FF232-3 | 1 yard – 1mt |
| 3. Spots FF233-3 | 1/2 yard – 50cm |
| 4. Blender circles FF234-3 | 1/4 yard – 25cm |
| 5. Blender chevrons FF235-3 | 3/4 yard – 70cm |
| 6. White | 1 yard – 1mt |
| 7. For the backing use fabric 4: | 3 yards – 2.75mt |
| 8. For the binding use fabric 3: | 1/2 yard – 50cm |

You will also need a piece of wadding approximately 63" square.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut eighteen rectangles 3.7/8" by 6.7/8", nine 3.1/2" squares

From fabric 2 cut and piece 3.1/2" strips: two 45.1/2" long, two 51.1/2" long, two 53.1/2" long, two 59.1/2" long

From fabric 3 cut thirty six 3.1/2" squares

From fabric 4 cut and piece 1.1/2" strips: two 51.1/2" long and two 53.1/2" long

From fabric 5 cut thirty six 3.1/2" squares, thirty six 3.7/8" squares

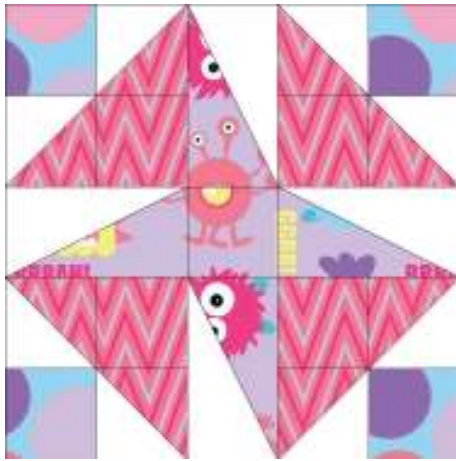
From fabric 6 (white) cut thirty six 3.7/8" squares, eighteen rectangles 3.7/8" by 6.7/8"

For the backing cut one 63" length of fabric 4 across the width of fabric. Cut two 21.1/2" lengths of fabric 14 across the width of fabric.

For the binding cut six 2.1/2" lengths of fabric 3 across the width of fabric.

All measurements include 1/4" seam allowances.

Sewing



Make half square triangle units using the 3.7/8" squares in fabrics 5 and 6. Place two squares with right sides together and mark a line along the diagonal. Sew a 1/4" seam either side of the marked line. Cut along the line to produce two half square triangle units from each pair of squares.

Make half rectangle triangles with the rectangles in fabrics 1 and 6. Cut each rectangle along one diagonal to make two triangles. Place a fabric 1 and a fabric 6 triangle with right sides together and sew them together along the diagonal, re forming the rectangle.

Lay the patchwork pieces out as shown with a fabric 1 square in the middle and a half rectangle triangle on each edge of the central square. Note the placements carefully – this is not a symmetric star. Each corner consists of a 4 patch unit made with a fabric 3 and fabric 5 square diagonally opposite each other and two half square triangles in the remaining places. These should now form a large fabric 5 triangle with a fabric 3 square in each corner of the block.

Sew the 4 patch units together first. You can now sew the patches together across each row and then sew the rows to each other to complete the block. Make nine of these.

The blocks are sewn together in three rows of three, but the blocks need to be rotated in order to make the design. It is easiest to look at the long rectangles – in the basic block shown above, the two fabric 1 rectangles across the middle form the shape of a hill. Use this shape to decide the rotation. In row 1 the hill in the first block is vertical, pointing right. In the second block it is horizontal pointing up and in the third block it is horizontal pointing down.

In row 2 the first block has the hill vertical pointing left, in the second block the hill is horizontal pointing up and in the third block it is vertical pointing right.

In row 3 the first block has the hill horizontal pointing up, in the second block the hill is horizontal pointing down and in the third block it is vertical pointing left.

Finishing the Monster Mayhem quilt

For border 1 sew the 45.1/2" lengths of fabric 2 to the top and bottom of the quilt and the 51.1/2" lengths to the sides.

For border 2 sew the 51.1/2" strips of fabric 4 to the top and bottom of the quilt and the 53.1/2" strips to the sides of the quilt.

For border 3 sew the 53.1/2" lengths of fabric 2 to the top and bottom of the quilt and the 59.1/2" lengths to the sides.



For the backing fabric you will need 63" squares of both backing fabric 4 and wadding. The image shows one way that you could make the size (using 3 different colours only to illustrate the layout).

Sew the two 21.1/2" lengths of fabric 4 together along one short side. This will give you a panel 21.1/2" wide by 84" long. Cut this to 63" long. Sew this panel to the 63" strip of fabric along the 63" edge.

For the binding, sew the six strips of fabric 3 together to give one very long strip to make the binding.
