Requirements

| 2. Small flowers FF133-1 | 3/4 yard – 70cm |
| 3. Large daisies FF136-1 | 3/4 yard – 70cm |
| 4. Blender FF134-1 | 1/4 yard – 25cm |
| 5. Leaf design FF135-1 | 3/4 yard – 70cm |

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut sixteen 4.1/2" squares, sixteen 4.7/8" squares

From fabric 2 cut forty rectangles 2.1.2" by 8.1/2"

From fabric 3 cut sixteen 4.7/8" squares, sixteen 2.1/2" squares and sixteen rectangles 2.1/2" by 4.1/2"

From fabric 4 cut forty one 2.1/2" squares

From fabric 5 cut the following 2.1/2" strips: two 42.1/2" long and two 46.1/2" long

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All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances.



Sewing

Make half square triangles using the $4\frac{7}{8}$ " squares: place a fabric 1 and a fabric 3 square with right sides together and mark a line along the diagonal. Sew a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam either side of the marked line and cut along the line. This will produce two half square triangle units.

Lay the patchwork out as shown with a $4\frac{1}{2}$ " fabric 1 square in the bottom left corner, a half square triangle unit top left and bottom right. The top right corner is made with a fabric 3 rectangle above $2\frac{1}{2}$ " fabric 3 and fabric 4 squares. Make

sixteen of these quilt blocks.

Assembling the Retro Floral quilt

Each row of the quilt is made with four quilt blocks alternating with three fabric 2 rectangles. Rotate the blocks as shown in the main photo so that the flowers point in different directions across the quilt.

Make four rows, using the photo to check which direction the blocks are facing.

Make five strips using four fabric 2 rectangles alternating with three fabric 4 squares, so that you have a fabric 2 rectangle at the beginning and end of each strip. Sew one of these strips between each row of blocks and one each at the top and bottom of the quilt.

Make two strips using four fabric 2 rectangles alternating with five fabric 4 squares, so that you have a fabric 4 square at the beginning and end of each strip. Sew one strip to each side of the quilt.

Sew the blocks together across each row and then sew the rows to each other.

For the border use $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strips of fabric 5. You will need two lengths of $42\frac{1}{2}$ " for the top and bottom of the quilt and two lengths of $46\frac{1}{2}$ " for the sides.
