

## Sound of Music Quilt Two

Designed by Rose Smith of  
Ludlow Quilt and Sew

Size 72" x 72"

All fabrics are from Sound of Music by  
Fabric Freedom

Please read through all the instructions before  
you begin

### Requirements

| 1. Sound of music FF211-2        | 2.1/4 yard – 2.0mt |
| 2. Brass instruments FF212-2     | 1.1/4 yard – 1.2mt |
| 3. Musical notes FF213-2         | 1.1/4 yard – 1.2mt |
| 4. Blender diamonds FF214-2      | 1 yard – 1mt       |
| 5. Blender stars FF215-2         | 3/4 yard – 70cm    |
| 6. For the backing use fabric 2: | 4 yards – 3.7mt    |
| 7. For the binding use fabric 4: | 1/2 yard – 50cm    |

You will also need a piece of wadding approximately 76" square.

### Cutting

From fabric 1 cut thirty six rectangles 3.1/2" by 6.1/2", thirty six 3.1/2" squares, seventy two 3.7/8" squares

From fabric 2 cut eighteen 3.7/8" squares, seventy two 3.1/2" squares

From fabric 3 cut twenty four rectangles 3.1/2" by 18.1/2" for the sashing

From fabric 4 sixteen 3.1/2" squares for the cornerstones in the sashing, fifty four 3.7/8" squares

From fabric 5 cut and piece 3.12" strips of fabric: two 66.1/2" long, two 72.1/2" long

For the backing cut one 76" length of fabric 2 across the width of fabric. Cut two 34.1/2" lengths of fabric 2 across the width of fabric.

For the binding cut seven 2.1/2" lengths of fabric 4 across the width of fabric.

All measurements include 1/4" seam allowances.

## Sewing



Make half square triangle units using the 3.7/8" squares in fabric 1 with either fabric 4 or 2. Place two squares with right sides together and mark a line along the diagonal. Sew a 1/4" seam either side of the marked line. Cut along the line to produce two half square triangle units from each pair of squares.

Lay the patchwork pieces out as shown.

In rows 1 and 6 there's a fabric 1 rectangle with a fabric 1 and 4 half square triangle on either side and fabric 2 squares at the ends.

In row 2 there's a fabric 4\1 half square triangle at each end with a fabric 2 square inside on each side. Then a fabric 1 square followed by a fabric 2\1 half square triangle.

In row 3 there's a fabric 1 square, fabric 2\1 half square triangle, then two fabric 4\1 half square triangles, followed by a fabric 1 rectangle.

In row 4 the order is reversed: fabric 1 rectangle, two fabric 4\1 half square triangles, fabric 2\1 half square triangle and a fabric 1 square.

In row 5 there's a fabric 4\1 half square triangle, fabric 2 square, fabric 2\1 half square triangle, fabric 1 square, fabric 2 square, fabric 4\1 half square triangle.

Sew the squares together across each row and then sew the rows to each other to complete the quilt block. Make nine of these.

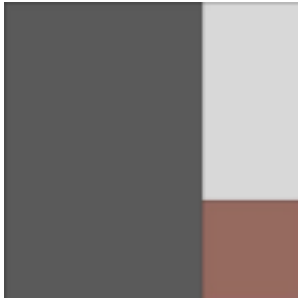
Sew the blocks together in three rows of three blocks with two fabric 3 sashing strips – so there is no sashing at either end of the block.

Make up four strips comprising three sashing strips with two fabric 4 squares between them. Sew one strip to the top and bottom of the quilt and one between each row of blocks.

Make two strips comprising three sashing strips with four fabric 4 squares between them, so that there is a fabric 4 square at the beginning and end of each strip as well as between the sashing strips. Sew one strip to each side of the quilt

## Finishing the Sound of Music quilt

For the border sew the two 66.1/2" lengths of fabric 5 to the top and bottom of the quilt and sew the two 72.1/2" strips to the sides.



For the backing fabric you will need 76" squares of both backing fabric 2 and wadding. The image shows one way that you could make the size (using 3 different colours only to illustrate the layout).

Sew the two 34.1/2" lengths of fabric 2 together along one short side. This will give you a panel 34.1/2" wide by 84" long. Cut this to 76" long. Sew this panel to the 76" strip of fabric along the 76" edge.

For the binding, sew the seven strips of fabric 4 together to give one very long strip to make the binding.
