Requirements

| 1. Rabbits FF108=2 | 1/2 yard – 50cm |
| 2. Daisies FF109-2 | 1/2 yard – 50cm |
| 3. Clouds FF110-2 | 1/2 yard – 50cm |
| 4. Birdboxes FF111-2 | 1/4 yard – 25cm |
| 5. Blender FF112-2 | 1/2 yard – 50cm |

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut nine 6.1/2" squares, sixteen 2.1/2" squares

From fabric 2 cut six 6.7/8" squares, four 7.1/4" squares

From fabric 3 cut two 6.7/8", one 7.1/4", two 2.1/2" lengths of 38.1/2", two 2.1/2" lengths of 42.1/2"

From fabric 4 cut four 6.7/8" squares, one 7.1/4" square

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From fabric 5 cut forty rectangles 2.1/2" by 6.1/2"

All measurements include 1/4" seam allowances.

Sewing

Make half square triangles using the 6.7/8" squares: place two squares with right sides together and mark a line along the diagonal. Sew a 1/4" seam either side of the marked line and cut along the line. This will produce two half square triangle units.

You need to make these with four squares each of fabrics 2 and 4, and with two squares each of fabrics 2 and 3.

Make quarter square triangles using the 7.1/4" squares. Cut each square along both diagonals, making four triangles from each square. Each quarter square triangle units consists of two fabric 2 triangles placed opposite each other and one triangle each of fabrics 3 and 4. Check the quilt image to be sure of the placement. Sew the triangles together in pairs and then sew the pairs to each other. You need four of these quarter square triangle units.

Assembling the Vegetable Patch quilt

The squares are laid out in five rows of five with sashing strips between them.

Rows 1 and 5 have a fabric 1 square at each end, a quarter square triangle unit in the middle and a half square triangle unit using fabrics 2 and 4 either side of the central square. Check the photo to make sure you have the triangles correctly placed. Place a fabric 5 rectangle between the squares but not at the ends of the rows – so you will have five squares and four rectangles in each row.

Rows 2 and 4 are made with a fabric 2/4 half square triangle at each end, a fabric 1 square in the middle with a fabric 2/3 half square triangle each side of the middle square. Place four fabric 5 rectangles between the five squares.

Row 3, the middle row, is made with a quarter square triangle unit at each end and three fabric 1 squares between them. Again you will need four fabric 5 rectangles between the squares.

Sew the squares and rectangles together across each row.

Make four strips comprising five fabric 5 rectangles sewn alternately with four fabric 1 2.1/2" squares. These are the sashing strips to place between the rows.

Sew the five rows together with the four sashing strips between the rows.

For the border use 2.1/2" strips of fabric 5. Sew the 38.1/2" strips to the top and bottom and the 42.1/2" strips to the sides of the quilt.
