

Winter Warmer Quilt One

by Fabric Freedom

Requirements

| 1. Winter warmer FF206-1 | 1.1/4 yard – 1.2mt |
| 2. Gifts FF207-1 | 1/2 yard – 50cm |
| 3. Snowflakes FF208-1 | 1/4 yard – 25cm |
| 4. Robins FF209-1 | 1.1/4 yard – 1.2mt |
| 5. Believe FF210-1 | 1.1/4 yard – 1.2mt |
| 6. White | 1 yard – 1mt |
| 7. For the backing use fabric 3 | 3.1/4 yards – 3 mt |
| 8. For the binding use fabric 1: | 1/2 yard – 50cm |

You will also need a piece of wadding approximately 66" square.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut forty eight 3.7/8" squares, thirty two 3.1/2" squares

From fabric 2 cut thirty two 3.7/8" squares

From fabric 3 cut and piece 1.1/2" lengths: two 54.1/2" long, two 56.1/2" long

From fabric 4 cut forty eight 3.7/8" squares, thirty two 3.1/2" squares

From fabric 5 cut and piece 3.1/2" strips of fabric: two 48.1/2" long, two 54.1/2" long, two 56.1/2" long and two 62.1/2" long.

From fabric 6 (white) cut sixty four 3.7/8" squares.

For the backing cut one 66" length of fabric 3 across the width of fabric. Cut two 24.1/2" lengths of fabric 3 across the width of fabric.

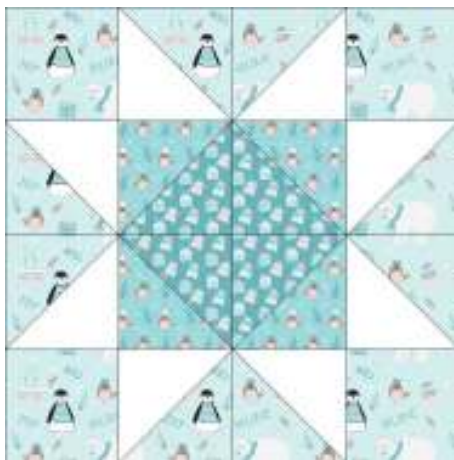
For the binding cut six 2.1/2" lengths of fabric 1 across the width of fabric.

All measurements include 1/4" seam allowances.

Sewing

The quilt is made using two quilt blocks (eight of each). In both of these the central diamond is the same fabric. In the first quilt block this is surrounded by fabric 4 with an outer edge of fabric 1. In the second block these are reversed, with fabric 1 around the central diamond and fabric 4 on the outer edge of the block.

Make half square triangle units using the 3.7/8" squares. Place two squares with right sides together and mark a line along the diagonal. Sew a 1/4" seam either side of the marked line. Cut along the line to produce two half square triangle units from each pair of squares.



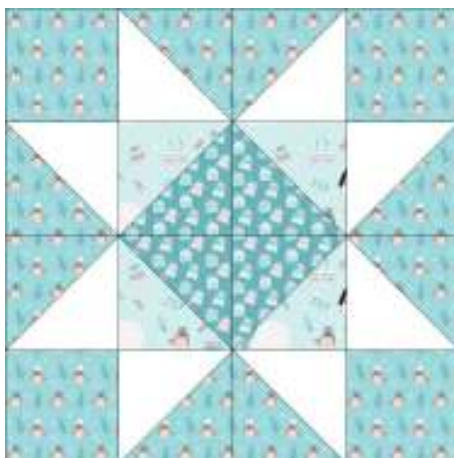
For the first quilt block lay the patchwork pieces out as shown.

In rows 1 and 6 there's a fabric 1 square at each end with two fabric 1/white half square triangles between them.

In rows 2 and 3 there's a fabric 1/white half square triangle at each end with two fabric 2/4 half square triangles between them.

Check the image to see which way to place the half square triangles.

Sew the squares together across each row and then sew the rows to each other to complete the quilt block. Make eight of these.



In the second quilt block, fabrics 1 and 4 are reversed.

In rows 1 and 6 there's a fabric 4 square at each end with two fabric f/white half square triangles between them.

In rows 2 and 3 there's a fabric4/white half square triangle at each end with two fabric 2/1 half square triangles between them.

Sew the squares together across each row and then sew the rows to each other to complete the second quilt block. Make eight of these.

Sew the blocks together in four rows of four, alternating the blocks across each row and down each column.

Finishing the Winter Warmer quilt

For border 1 sew the two 48.1/2" lengths of fabric 1 to the top and bottom of the quilt and sew the two 54.1/2" strips to the sides.

For border 2 sew the two 54.1/2" lengths of fabric 3 to the top and bottom of the quilt and sew the two 56.1/2" lengths to the sides.

For border 3 sew the two 56.1/2" lengths of fabric 1 to the top and bottom of the quilt and sew the two 62.1/2" lengths to the sides.



For the backing fabric you will need 66" squares of both backing fabric 3 and wadding. The image shows one way that you could make the size (using 3 different colours only to illustrate the layout).

Sew the two 24.1/2" lengths of fabric 3 together along one short side. This will give you a panel 24.1/2" wide by 84" long. Cut this to 66" long. Sew this panel to the 66" strip of fabric along the 66" edge.

For the binding, sew the six strips of fabric 1 together to give one very long strip to make the binding.
